A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CUTLER BAY, FLORIDA, THANKING ALL FIRST RESPONDERS, THE HEALTH CARE COMMUNITY AND CRITICAL ESSENTIAL EMPLOYEES FOR THEIR BRAVE RESPONSE TO THE CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 PANDEMIC.

WHEREAS, in late 2019, a new significant outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) emerged throughout the World and was declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern by the World Health Organizations; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020 the State Surgeon General and State Health Officer declared a Public Health Emergency exists in the State of Florida as a result of the COVID-19 disease; and

WHEREAS, first responders, the health care community, and essential workers have shown their unwavering commitment to assist those in need even at the risk of exposing themselves and their loved ones to this disease; and

WHEREAS, it is the same for those working on another frontline, those called to remain at their post to provide goods and services that are essential to our way of life - that includes countless manufacturing workers, farmers and farm workers, restaurant workers, delivery drivers, cashiers and grocery store employees who are keeping our stores stocked and food on our tables; and

WHEREAS, while the COVID-19 pandemic has upended life for nearly everyone, these essential workers have had to face more risks than most, and the Town would like to thank those who are making sacrifices every day providing essential services during this most difficult time; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council would like to thank Florida Governor Ron DeSantis, local and State Mayors, leaders in Congress and Administration officials who are working tirelessly, constructively, and responsively to keep Florida moving; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council recognizes the heroic efforts provided by first responders, the health care community, and critical essential employees, and together with the residents of the Town offer our sincere thanks to all those on the front lines in the battle against this COVID-19 pandemic.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CUTLER BAY, FLORIDA, THAT:
