
On June 22, 2017, the Miami-Dade Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Governing Board approved Resolution #26-17 approving the list of 2017 Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) priority projects (attached). Dear Ms. Bouclé and Mr. Gastesi:

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is pleased to inform you that the selection process for this year's Transportation Alternatives (TA) Cycle has been finalized. This process was a collaborative effort between FDOT, Miami-Dade Transportation Planning Organization's (TPO) Committees and Monroe County's Evaluation Committee. Please find the attached list of projects that ranked highest during the selection process and are recommended for programming in FDOT's Tentative Work Program (FY2019 - FY 2023), which is currently being developed. Projects are programmed dependent on project readiness and funding availability. Funding is subject to the availability of federal funds and an annual appropriation by the legislature (the spending authority).

Programming of Miami Dade County's projects is pending the TPO Governing Board's approval. Once approved, the TPO will provide notification of the selection status to the Miami-Dade agencies that applied for project funding. Monroe County's projects do not require additional approvals. FDOT will notify the appropriate Monroe County agencies of their selection status. We appreciate the time and effort that all applicants put into preparing and presenting their projects to our District's Scoping Committee.

FDOT remains committed to the Transportation Alternatives program and looks forward to continue working with all of our stakeholders to improve the project selection and prioritization process.
