

RESOLUTION NO. 19-__

**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL
OF THE TOWN OF CUTLER BAY, FLORIDA,
DESIGNATING LINCOLN CITY PARK AS A NATURAL
PRESERVE; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTATION; AND
PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, Lincoln City Park is an undeveloped mini-park within the Town's jurisdiction located at SW 214 Street and SW 99 Avenue (the "Park"); and

WHEREAS, a Natural Forest Community Quantitative Evaluation conducted by Miami-Dade County found that the Park qualifies as environmentally endangered land for tax reduction purposes or a natural forest community; and

WHEREAS, natural forest communities are rare upland plant communities that are protected in Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council desires to preserve and restore the Park, and use the Park as an opportunity to raise awareness and educate future generations of the rare plants, animals and geologic features that are part of this community's natural heritage; and

WHEREAS, the Town finds that this Resolution is in the best interest of the Town and its residents.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN
COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CUTLER BAY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. **Recitals.** The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. **Preservation Lincoln City Park.** The Town Council hereby directs the Town Manager to preserve and restore the Park's natural habitat.

Section 3. **Implementation.** The Town Manager is hereby authorized to take any and all action which is reasonably necessary to implement the purpose of this Resolution. The Town Manager is further authorized to adopt reasonable rules and regulations pertaining to the use and operation of the Park.

Section 4. **Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
