RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL TOWN OF CUTLER BAY. OF THE FLORIDA. EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO PROPOSED FLORIDA HOUSE BILL 17, WHICH EXPRESSLY PREEMPTS LOCAL REGULATION GOVERNMENT OF **BUSINESSES**, PROFESSIONS, AND OCCUPATIONS TO THE STATE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Municipal Home Rule (a component of Local Government Home Rule) is an important attribute of municipal government in Florida; and

WHEREAS, Municipal Home Rule is essential in reflecting the local needs and desires of local communities; and

WHEREAS, Proposed Florida House Bill 17 threatens to diminish Municipal Home Rule by expressly preempting to the State the regulation of Businesses, professions, and occupations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CUTLER BAY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Recitals.</u> The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein.

Section 2. Opposition to HB 17. The Town Council hereby opposes HB 17, which threatens to diminish Municipal Home Rule by expressly preempting to the State the regulation of businesses, professions, and occupations.

<u>Section 3.</u> <u>Transmittal by Clerk.</u> The Town Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, Florida League of Cities, and the Chair and Members of the Miami Dade County State Legislative Delegation, including all Miami Dade County Municipal cities.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
