Project Narrative:

The Town of Cutler Bay is requesting \$10,000 to install Florida Native trees/palms at Lakes by the Bay (LBTB) Park located at 8551 SW 216 Street Cutler Bay, FL 33189; bordering the beautiful wetlands of Biscayne Bay. The approximately nineteen (19) acre parcel of land is currently cleared with no trees and features an approximately twenty-one (21) acre natural lake lines by mangroves that attract an array of endangered and migratory birds. The Town is conducting a series of four (4) public involvement meetings to design an environmentally sensitive passive park that includes a Canoe/Kayak Launch; Pavilions with educational signs; previous walking paths; and parking. This \$400,000 project is being partially funded by a \$200,000 FDEP Land & Water Grant. Residents request that the Town re-introduces Native Trees (Hardwood Hammock) that will create canopy, and also serve as a refuge for the birds that visit the wetlands. This sentiment has been echoed by the Town's Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee (see attached meeting minutes). Funding from the FDACS will allow the Town to incorporate this valuable input from the community.

The Town will meet the following objectives/outcomes (1) Plant Florida Native Trees: Demonstrate proper urban forestry principles and introduce salt tolerant trees that will create canopy and create a sanctuary for wading birds (i.e. red shouldered hawks, ospreys, ibis, egrets). (2) Educate the Public: The Town will install educational signs in the planned Pavilions and/or near the planted trees to promote the use of Florida Native trees on private property. Plan of Action: (Planning and Design: July 2017-November 2017) The Town is working with a firm that has developed three renderings for the property including landscaping (see attached rendering of the most popular plan). The Town is considering tropical species such as mahogany (Swietenia mahogoni), gumbo limbo (Bursera simaruba), and live oak (Quercus virginiana). (Permitting: December 2017-March 30, 2018) The Town will finalize the plans and complete permitting of the project. (Planting: April 1, 2018-August 31, 2018) The Town has procured a landscaping company that is able to provide, plant, and maintain the selected trees in accordance with the final plans from the consulting firm (Marlin Engineering). The Town will not need to secure any additional bids for this project. (Project Closeout: September 1 - 30, 2018) The Town will submit all final project documents and invite FDACS conduct final inspection. The Town's Parks and Recreation committee has established contact with representatives from the Nature Conservancy and Everglades National Park as potential project partners. These two agencies have provided feedback regarding the types of trees that will be preferred on the land; and their input will be considered during the final planning and design.

This project is overseen by the Public Works Director, Mr. Alfredo Quintero Jr., ISA Certified Arborist # FL-6489A, expires December 31, 2018. Mr. Quintero attends public involvement meetings, coordinates with all consultants, and inspects trees prior to planting (15% time commitment). The Grants Coordinator, LaKeesha Morris will coordinate the grant execution process, track time-line and expenses, and submit all required reports (10% time commitment). The Town has four (4) years of experience successfully implementing FDACS projects. This will be the Town's second year requesting funding for tree planting. Cutler Bay is a Tree City (since 2009) and Growth Award Recipient (since 2012). The Town has planted over 3,500 new trees since adopting our Tree Master Plan in 2009. Our goal is to plant 6,724 trees to reach 100% canopy.

The Town will plant up to 25 trees. Costs are estimated as follows:

Live Oak \$800 each x approximately 12 Gumbo Limbo \$600 each x approximately 8 Mahogany \$650 each x approximately 5

Total Estimated Cost for Planting = \$17,650 (includes purchase, delivery, installation, and grow in maintenance)

Total Estimated Cost for In-Kind Match = \$2,350

Total Budget: \$20,000

The Town will bill \$500 per tree to the FDACS Grant, and will use the balance as cash match.

In accordance with FDACS Specifications;

- Trees/palms shall be Florida Grade #1 or equivalent (Florida Division of Plant Industry, Grades and Standards).
- Trees shall not exceed a 4-inch caliper. Palms shall not be taller than 16 feet, clear trunk.
- Minimum tree size is 1 and 1/2 inch caliper, in at least a 15 gallon container.
- · At least three tree species native to the area and suitable for the site and objective shall be planted.
- Trees listed on the Exotic Pest Plant Council's MOST RECENT list of Florida's Invasive Species shall not be planted.

The Town has removed all invasive species from the property.

Qualifications:

Alfredo Quintero is the Town's Public Works Director and ISA Certified Arborist (2012 to Present). Mr. Quintero has a Master's Degree in Civil Engineering from Florida International University. Some of his industry certifications include; State Certified General Contractor, State Certified Roofing Contractor, Certified Flood Plain Manager, FSA Florida Stormwater Operator Levels I and II, Stormwater Erosion and Sedimintation Control Inspector, GI-BMP Certification, Florida Commercial Fertilizer License.

As the Town's Public Works Director, Mr. Quintero is responsible for the design, construction, management and maintenance of the Town's infrastructure, including streets, landscaping, sidewalks and storm drains. In addition, the Public Works Department manage community volunteer programs for beautification and clean-up projects. The permitting section reviews and issues permits including paving and drainage, driveway approach, and utility plans, through the Building Department. The department also assists with information or questions regarding street signs, street lights, and flood maps.

Under Mr. Quintero's management, the Public Works Department has earned 18 industry awards for various roadway and drainage improvement projects; including Mr. Quintero's award of Project Manager of the Year. The Town has also been a Tree City USA since 2009, and has received the Growth Award each year since 2012.

REQUEST

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CUTLER BAY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE TOWN MANAGER TO SUBMIT A GRANT APPLICATION WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND CONSUMER SERVICES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

During the 2016-17 fiscal year, the Town of Cutler Bay was awarded a grant award of \$13,500 from the Urban and Community Forestry Grant Program to implement a tree planting demonstration at the Town Center Building. The long-term goal of the Florida Friendly Landscaping and Tree Planting Project is to raise awareness about Florida Friendly best practices and native tree planting throughout the community, and inspire residents/business owners to seek out Florida Friendly certification for their properties. Planting of the new trees were completed in August 18, 2017.

The Town wishes to continue our efforts to increase the number of Florida Native Trees in public spaces throughout the Town by submitting a new FY2017 State of Florida Department of Agriculture Grant in the amount of \$10,000. This new grant will complement the Canoe/Kayak Launch Project at the Lakes by the Bay Park. If funded, the Town will be able to plant up to twenty-five (25) Florida Native canopy trees. As you are aware, the Town is in the process of conducting a series of public involvement meetings to help with the planning and design of the Canoe/Kayak Launch and environmental education project at Lakes by the Bay Park. The installation of canopy trees that will attract birds to the wetland is of great interest to the Town's residents.

The purpose of the Forestry Grant Program is to cooperate with local governments to promote the planting and protection of trees to improve the livability of urban environments within the State of Florida. The Town is required to provide a fifty percent (50%) match of the total Project costs. The required match can be in the form of in-kind costs (Town staff salaries) and cash match.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Town Council approve the attached Resolution.








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
