### Cutler Ridge Park Lighting Enhancement Project

### **Project Narrative**

The Town of Cutler Bay is requesting \$86,000 to assist with the replacement of twenty-eight (28) outdated 1,500 watt bulbs with twenty-four (24) energy efficient 1150 watt LED Bulbs on the athletic field of Cutler Ridge Park located at 10100 SW 200 Street Cutler Bay, FL 33157. Cutler Bay is a local municipality in Miami-Dade County. Current population estimates (as of April 1, 2017) from the University of Florida BEBR indicate approximately 45,222 residents (US Census 2010 = 40,286). Federal financial assistance is being requested for this park because similar to most communities in Florida, the Town is recovering from Hurricane Irma. One of our Parks (Franjo) remains closed and over 50% of the lighting was destroyed. The unexpected financial impact of this has placed a strain on the Parks Department's budget. It also reminded us of how important our parks are. Cutler Ridge Park is the Town's secondary Emergency Operations Center, In accordance with the Town's emergency operations plan, Cutler Ridge Park serves as a primary site for ice and emergency aid following a natural disaster. We saw this plan in action during the storm when lighting was repaired and the park was open for ice distribution within four (4) days Hurricane Irma's passing. It is imperative that we seek every opportunity to improve the resources of this park.

Cutler Ridge Park (10 acres) is the Town's most active park. The field lighting schedule is Monday-Friday from 6:00 pm – 10:00 pm, and Saturdays from 6:00 pm – 9:00 pm (the lights are turned on at 7:30 pm during daylight savings time). The Town operates an after-school and summer camp program for youth in grades K-5 that serves approximately 200 youth annually. The Town's only public pool is located at this park; providing swimming lessons, exercise classes, open swim, and serving as a practice location for swim teams from local schools. The Cutler Ridge Soccer Club has operated for over 50 years and uses the park daily; serving over 450 athletes age 4-18. The Town regularly hosts community events such as movie nights, cooking contests, community fairs, and more; attracting over 10,000 residents and guests each year. Residents may rent out the community center or fields. Residents also frequent the park to use the playground, attend exercise classes, use the universally accessible outdoor fitness equipment, play on the sports fields, or walk on the track.

The Town will use federal funding to install new lighting on the fields. The Park currently has four (4) poles with seven (7) lights each. The lights are 1500 watt metal halide. The lighting will be retrofitted with twenty-four (24) 1150 LED lights. The lighting contractor estimates that switching to these bulbs will save approximately 37% annually in energy. These lights will also reduce light pollution that is currently generated by the old light format. This project is aligned with the US Department of Energy's national goals to create market transformation by encouraging local governments to implement "lasting changes in the structure of function of a market or

the behavior of market participants, resulting in an increase in adoption of energy efficiency and renewable energy products, services and practices". The Town of Cutler Bay is a leader in South Florida for implementing green best practices. In 2009, the Town of Cutler Bay initiated the "Go Green" initiative. This initiative led to the Town becoming the first municipality in Miami-Dade County to receive the Florida Green City designation Florida Green Building Coalition. The Town is currently recognized as a "Certified Silver" City. The Town lobbied Florida lawmakers and was instrumental in the adoption of House Bill 7179 in 2010 which created Florida's Property Assessment Clean Energy (PACE) program. This bipartisan local government initiative allows property owners to finance energy efficiency and renewable energy projects for their homes and commercial buildings, simply and with no government subsidies. The Town created the first "Green Corridor" PACE Program in Miami-Dade County in partnership with seven (7) municipalities; Cutler Bay, Coral Gables, Palmetto Bay, Pinecrest, Miami. Miami Shores and South Miami. Together, or partnership has financed 2,548 projects in the amount of over \$72.5 Million, and 1,298 construction projects totaling over \$9 Million; and more Counties and municipalities continue to adopt the PACE program each year. It is estimated that this project will reduce carbon dioxide output by nearly 35,000 metric tons.

Implementation Strategy: The Town is prepared to quickly implement this project. If awarded funding the project will be overseen by the Parks and Recreation Director, Etienne Bejarano. Etienne will work with LaKeesha Morris the Town's Grants Coordinator to complete the contract execution process between the Town and the FDACS. This will be completed within the first 90 days of intent to award funding from the FDACS. Etienne will then follow the required procurement process to hire a vendor to install the lighting. We expect that the vendor will be able to complete the installation within three to six months. Etienne will supervise the installation. LaKeesha will be responsible for completing the necessary grant reports and any press releases regarding the new project. Etienne will then implement the 12-month data tracking process. It is expected that the installation will be complete no later than February 2019, and data tracking will be complete by February 2020. The Town will provide the final report with data tracking documentation to the State no later than May 2020.

### Qualifications:

The Parks and Recreation Director, Mr. Etienne Bejarano will oversee the implementation of this project. Mr. Bejarano has over ten (10) years of experience with administrative and managerial work, planning, organizing, and directing the activities of the Park and Recreation Department. He earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Physical Education and Health from the University of Carolina. He is certified in the Florida League of Cities Park & Recreation Safety & Inspection Program. His role as the Parks and Recreation Director is to supervise, select, train, direct, and evaluation department personnel of over 30 employees. He also evaluates the effectiveness of recreation areas, facilities, and services of nine (9) parks, and manages an overall department budget of over \$2 million.

Mr. Bejarano is a hand-on executive that worked on the planning of this project. He met with potential contractors to visit the park-site and discuss the Town's plans. Identified the best use of grant dollars, and assisted with the development of the proposal. As the project lead, he will oversee the procurement process, supervise contract and Town staff, and assist with the preparation of any required programmatic or fiscal reports. The Town has identified the tasks necessary to implement the program. If awarded funding, the Town will be required to seek Council Approval to execute the grant contract and bid out the installation of the new lighting. We expect that we will be able to complete these tasks within 120 days of notice of award. This project can be completed within six (6) months of contract execution, and the Mr. Bejarano will continue to monitor energy savings for a period of twelve (12) months will the assistance of the Town's finance department.

The Town of Cutler Bay was established in 2009, and has consistently managed federal, state and local grants without any findings or corrective actions. The Town's Grants Coordinator, LaKeesha Morris, MSW, is trained in federal contract compliance and has successfully written and managed grants from the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services for the past four (4) years. The team members are in place to administer this grant, and all equipment and supplies will be provided by the selected contractor that will install the new lighting.




