#### **Problem Identification**

The Town of Cutler Bay proposes to use \$4,939 Byrne/Jag Funding to continue the Cutler Bay Youth Safety Program conducted by the Town's Neighborhood Resource Unit Officers. This project will serve to reduce instances of school violence, improve the safety of bicyclists and pedestrians, and improve personal safety of children and residents. The Town has three primary areas of concern that we hope to reduce by increasing officer presence and community oriented policing tactics.

- (1) School Violence and/or Bullying: The Town aims to reduce instances of bullying and school violence by conducting presentations at schools and youth programs throughout the Town. The Town will also educate teachers and caregivers about recognizing signs of bullying and reporting.
- (2) Property Safety: Although the Town's crime rates are low, we continue to see increases in Larceny and Auto Theft. During community outreach events, residents have voiced concerns of bicycle thefts. The Town regularly hosts bike safety events and will add the distribution of bicycle locks to this educational activity.
- (3) Personal Safety: The Town is currently planning to implement the radKIDS safety education program to empower children to recognize, avoid and resist harm or danger. Funding will be used to purchase educational material and give-a-ways to distribute during presentations.

This project is consistent with the Town's adopted strategic master plan under Goal #6.1 for Public Safety - "to provide a safe and secure community for Cutler Bay's residents and business community". The Police Department has increased outreach activities to include conducting bullying presentations at local schools, hosting events such as "coffee with a cop" to give residents an opportunity to meet our officers and discuss their concerns, and crime prevention workshops conducted by the Town Major. Unfortunately, a comparison of this year's crime statistics shows that forcible sex offences, robbery, and aggravated assault/burglary are slightly higher than that rates this same time in 2018. Town still enjoys a low crime rate when compared to Miami-Dade County as a whole. The implementation of the radKIDS program will teach our youth to be more aware of their environment.

#### **Project Summary (Scope of Work)**

The Town's Neighborhood Resource Unit will work closely with local schools, homeowner associations, the Town's Parks and Recreation Department, and after-school programs to educate a minimum of 1,000 residents in one or more of the primary areas. Activities will include;

(1) Make a minimum of three (3) Presentations at schools, homeowner association

meetings, and/or after-school programs by December 2019.

- (2) Attend a minimum of four (4) community events/public meetings to distribute educational and promotional material by December 2019.
- (3) Distribute educational material at key locations around Town (i.e. Southland Mall, Town Hall Center, Afterschool Programs, Schools, Places of Worship, Apartment Complexes).
- (4) Attend a minimum of one (1) bike safety events to distribute bike locks to residents along with bicycle/pedestrian safety information.

This provides greater confidence that our first responders are certified and equipped meet the needs of the Town's residents and each other in the event of an emergency.
