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

#### **1.** Organization Background Information

Village Church is a community of real and authentic believers who value loving God and loving one's neighbors above all else. We realize that we all fall short of God's standards daily, so we don't pretend to be perfect. We talk about real life issues and how the word of God applies to those issues. We are a community that wants to do life with the people of Cutler Bay and impact those lives for the betterment and growth of the community. Village Church started in Cutler Bay, FL at Cutler Bay Middle School, and it is led by Pastor John Michael Gibson and his wife, Brittany. They both moved to Cutler Bay from South Carolina and have a heart for coming alongside the city to help with initiating change and creating a better community with each passing day.

We had our first gathering in August 2019 and have been striving to impact the lives of all community members since that time. Part of what makes us so successful at reaching our community is not just our gatherings but our community outreach. We provided breakfast for all of the students at Cutler Bay Middle School on the first day of school, hosted free ice cream nights for the community, and helped raise finances for twenty-three local families that were displaced during an apartment fire right here in Cutler Bay.

Some of our most memorable community outreach moments have been, a public Thanksgiving dinner, a Christmas party for special needs students in Cutler Bay, and feeding the staff and students at Cutler Bay Middle School. Our goal now is to extend our reach one step further and make sure that no student goes home hungry. We have designed and implemented an active program where our homeless and displaced students will have 7 meals that they can take home with them every weekend inside of a backpack. We call this mission our "Backpack Program". By receiving this grant, we believe that this program will change the way that students in need perceive school, increase test scores, their overall mood and outlook on life, and better the community of Cutler Bay as a whole.

#### 2. Project Description

The "Backpack Program" is designed to meet the needs of students in poverty on a weekly basis by filling the backpack with 7 meals that students can take home every Friday. The students are expected to take care of the backpack, consume the meals over the weekend, and return the backpack Monday morning. We will use a check-in/check-out system in order to have accountability for the backpacks. We provide seven meals so that students can have two breakfast items, two lunch items, and three dinners. This ensures students do not go hungry while away from school. This is key since they don't receive school lunch during weekends. We step in and fill that gap. We also include 2 sets of snack items in the backpack as well to supplement the meals. We have set up a food station to store items, fill backpacks, and distribute them on Fridays. We have been actively running about 30-40 students per week, and we have plans for growth through this continued support.

The project is needed at Cutler Bay Middle School because we have encountered that there are many homeless and displaced students that attend this school. These students carry a vast amount of needs. They include, but are not limited to, emotional support, guidance, increased assistance in their educational journey, and a dependable source of food. We believe that through this program we can tackle these needs, specifically the latter. There are too many students that are going hungry and have no dependable source of nutrition over the weekend. The program is also needed because these students will now be receiving healthy food which will help them feel better and help their bodies grow stronger. Carrying out this initiative today will help develop these students into the leaders this community needs tomorrow.

Our main target that we are looking to serve is the aforementioned homeless and displaced students of Cutler Bay Middle School. We feel a strong sense of urgency to reach them and make sure that they are well fed and supported. This program will benefit students by allowing them to be

#### 3. Method or Strategy for Implementation

The best part of the "Backpack Program" is that we have already begun to successfully operate. At this point, we have been operating for three weeks. We have designed a great strategy for implementing this program and having it be successful in the long run. The support for this grant will ensure that we are able to impact more students for a longer period of time. Village Church will be responsible for the overall management of the program, purchasing and distributing of goods, internal management, community involvement, and relationship development.

The individuals volunteering for this program will be Pastor John Michael Gibson, Andy Iglesias, Marco Antonio Gonzalez, and Stephanie Velasco, and we each have a vital role in the program. Mr. Gibson is the founder of the program and will oversee all operations. Mr. Iglesias will be hands on purchasing the goods, packaging the backpacks for distribution, and be the point of contact for communications between Village Church, the students, and Cutler Bay Middle School. Mr. Gonzalez will handle the administrative side; making sure that we have proper meal plans that meet our guidelines and proper inventory management. He will also handle all internal processes and paperwork, such as but not limited to directories, time sheets, and other types of community aid and partnerships. Ms. Velasco is employed by MDCPS, and helps identify the students who could benefit from the program, in connection with the guidance department. She sets up meetings with the students so that we can give them meals and communicate with them about the structure of the program. This allows us to have a steady influx of students and scale our growth. We believe that this is a very intuitive and stable system that can guarantee long term success for the program and most of all, a great benefit for the community and students of Cutler Bay. We look forward to growing and expanding our operation through this grant.

#### 4. Evaluation of the Project

We have a variety of ways to measure the success of the "Backpack Program" that will be vital to its continued support and growth. Our goal is to see the students overall mental, emotional, and physical health to improve through this program. We realize that food is a major contributor to all of those areas of a students' lives. We believe that through the program we will show an increase in overall happiness of the child, improved focus at school, and improvement in the classroom. We will follow up with the school employee in charge of the displaced/homeless students to see how the children are positively affected by the program. Through the combination of both internal and external data, we will analyze all areas of the program and develop areas of improvement as we go. We believe that this model is scalable and can be grown to the point where we are assisting other schools in the Cutler Bay community.
