6. QUASI-JUDICIAL HEARINGS (PUBLIC HEARING REQUIRED)

A. A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CUTLER BAY, FLORIDA, APPROVING THE SITE PLAN OF VILLAGE OF CUTLER PROPERTIES LC TO PERMIT TWENTY-NINE (29) SINGLE FAMILY HOMES ON PROPERTY LOCATED AT 18551 OLD CUTLER ROAD (FOLIO # 36-6003-001-0013), AS LEGALLY DESCRIBED IN EXHIBIT "A", CONSISTING OF APPROXIMATELY +/-8.43 ACRES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

> Town Clerk Debra Eastman read the title of the Resolution. Town Attorney Chad Friedman read the rules of the Quasi-Judicial proceedings. Town Clerk Debra Eastman provided the oath to those who wish to speak on the item. Town Attorney Chad Friedman explained the Quasi process and gave the history of this item. Interim Community Development Director Alex David provided a presentation which included the history, the evaluation, plan review, conditions, and option D.

The applicant's attorney, Juan Mayol introduced the members of his team and provided a twenty minute presentation which included no wetlands impact and that they are not seeking any accomodations.

Mayor Meerbott opened the public hearing. Paola Moseley and Gloria Kelly spoke in opposition. Barbara Condon, Michelle Craven, Dr. Amy Roder, Tom Condon and Eduardo de Aragon spoke in opposition. Robert Gonzalez representing the Board of Directors of Cutler Cay, spoke about conversations with the developer regarding possible ways of mitigation of annoyances for Cutler Cay, with which makes the Board more inclined to support the project. There being no one else wishing to speak, Mayor Meerbott closed the public hearing. Attorney Juan Mayol provided rebuttal.

Mayor Meerbott opened discussion and the Town Council discussed traffic and the traffic study, invasive plants, the FLUEDRA hearings that have taken place on the proposed development, compliance with the Land Development Regulations, lack of mass transit, wetlands, drainage and adjusting the wall height to six feet. Mr. Mayol agreed to the wall adjustment.

Vice Mayor Loyzelle made a motion to approve the item with the wall adjustment. Mayor Meerbott called for a second and there was none. A motion was made by Council Member Callahan, seconded by Council Member Duncan, that this Resolution be denied. The motion carried by the following vote:
